






BUILD MASTERY OF SKILLS AND EXPERTISE

- You need 10,000 hours (Gladwell) or 10,000 iterations (Naval) to achieve mastery of a skill – there is no shortcut there
- Leverage compounding by building layers of practice over time
- 1 skill good, 2 skills better, multiple skills best
- Outwork everyone around you by:
 - Applying yourself more than everyone around you
 - Committing yourself more than everyone else.
 - Studying your craft, industry, or specialty more than everyone else
- Be like an athlete train, compete, recover - repeat




